Year 2 and 3 mixed Orange Class September 2019

A guide for children and parents

In September your child will be moving into Year 2 and 3 mixed. Their class teacher will be Mrs Derrick.

Daily routines

The door (please see map) will open at 8:50am, and children are asked to be at their classroom by this time. Children will have a phonic or spelling lesson in an appropriate group for their current stage of attainment.

Pegs for coats and PE bags are located outside the classroom in the porch area. Children should put their packed lunches on the trolley inside the classroom and bring their water bottles with them

Year 3 pupil's school lunches must be ordered and paid for on Monday morning for the following week.

We would ask Year 2 and 3 parents to **leave** their child at the classroom door and allow them to enter the classroom on their own. Parents can speak to Mrs Derrick briefly and informally at this time.

Children should hand in any money (in a named envelope) and slips or letters as soon as they come in to the classroom. Mrs Derrick will take the register.

Children in Year 2 get a piece of fresh fruit every day free of charge. Year 3 parents can send a piece fruit daily if they choose. Parents who would like their child to have milk should

complete and return a **milk slip** with payment, as required, to the school office.

The class will have two **PE lessons** every week (to be confirmed). Parents who wish their child to be excused from PE for medical reasons should inform Mrs Derrick before school or via a note.

Lunchtime routines

Children in Year 2 and 3 will be dismissed for lunchtime at 12.10 o'clock. They will have their lunch in the dining room, irrespective of whether they have school meals or packed lunches. They will then play on the yard or the field (weather permitting).

End of the day routines

The school day ends at 3:00pm for Year 2 and 3 children. Please collect Year 2 and 3 children from the Year 2 and 3 classroom door. Parents who also have to collect other children are asked to collect their youngest children first and walk around to the other yard to collect any older children. Staff will wait in their porch until your older children are collected. In order to ensure their safety, children in Year 2 and 3 are not allowed to go to the other yard on their own, or leave the premises without an adult.

Other information

Homework will be given out each week on Friday and should be returned by Thursday of the next week. Please help to support your child's

learning by ensuring their homework is returned on time, and inform the class teacher if there are any problems with this. Children will have their own reading book relating to the school scheme which is matched to their reading age. This will be taken home on a nightly basis to read with parents / carers. A reading diary should be used as a two way communication with home. Individual reading will take place twice every week with an adult in school.

You will be invited to attend a parents' meeting every term. Mrs Derrick will talk to you about your child's learning and the progress they are making.
