Communication and Language

Listening and attention: Listening to stories and rhymes with enjoyment. Remembering stories with increasing recall. Maintaining attention, concentration and sits quietly during appropriate activities. Understanding: Responding to simple instructions. Speaking: Use talk to organise, sequence and clarify thinking, ideas, feelings and events. Building up vocabulary and exploring meaning. Interact with others, negotiating plans and activities and taking turns in conversation.

Literacy

Phonics- Phase 1, 2 Enjoys rhyming and rhythmic activities. Beginning to recognise and write our names with independence. Hears and says the initial sound in words. Can segment the sounds in simple words and blend them together and knows which letters represent some of them. Gives meaning to marks they make as they draw, write and paint. Writing labels and captions. Toy shop labelling. Beginning to form letters correctly. Labelling pictures and writing lists. Suggested stories: Dogger, Kippers toy box, Whatever Next

Personal Social and Emotional

Circle Time Games- Settling in, talking about expectations, routines, names, emotions and feelings, getting to know you. Mr and Mrs Potato Head's class rules. Confident to speak to others about own needs, wants, interests and opinions. Special toys show and tell Can describe self in positive terms and talk about abilities. Demonstrates friendly behaviour, initiating conversations and forming good relationships, attends to and takes account of what others say. Autumn term

Expressive Arts and Design Enjoys joining in with dancing and ring games. Sings a few familiar songs- Nursery and number rhymes. Understands that they can use lines to enclose a space, and then begin to use these shapes to represent objects.
