Prevention Through Education

At present, our team is delivering sessions to year 6 and year 8 students at the <u>SafetyWorks!</u> facility in Newcastle, meaning we aren't visiting schools for the time being.

The Violence Reduction Unit's (VRU) education team — which is part of the Office of the Police and Crime Commissioner for Northumbria — can provide sessions in schools on a number of topics: Knife Crime; Malicious Communications; Drugs & Alcohol (NEWCASTLE ONLY); and County Lines. The main focus of their work is with 11-16 year olds, and they have a 'Philosophy for Children' package for KS2 students.
